Outside the Mill: the diverse environments of Julie's meadow, River Evenlode, the pond and Mill Wood can be used for any science or geography teaching and learning...

Science national curriculum requirements - Living things and their habitats:

- Describe the differences in the lifecycle of a mammal, an amphibian, an insect and a bird
- Describe the life processes of reproduction in some plants and animals
- Describe how living things are classified into broad groups according to common observable characteristics and based on similarities and differences, including micro-organisms, plants and animals
- Give reasons for classifying plants and animals based on specific characteristics.
